Beware of Senior Citizen Scams

Seniors are duped out of more money every year than any other age group. Remember these important tips.

- <u>Do not</u> answer calls from people claiming to be with the IRS saying there's an issue with your tax return.
- <u>Do not</u> take calls from people claiming to be a Medicare representative who needs to verify your Medicare ID#.
- Social Security will <u>never</u> call to ask for your bank information or SSN.
- <u>Do not</u> accept unsolicited calls for tech support.
- If an offer sounds too good to be true, it probably is! This is one of the oldest tricks in the book!
- Never answer a call that begins with "Are you there?" or "Can you hear me?"
- Watch out for the Grandparents Scam when someone pretends to be a family member, often a grandchild, and claims to be in urgent need of money to cover an emergency, medical care, or a legal problem.
- Report incidents to local law enforcement and the Federal Trade Commission at <u>ReportFraud.FTC.gov</u>
